The Clyde City Council has allocated $\$ 10,000$ per year for the purchase of concrete to be used in the construction or replacement of sidewalks that the City believes are unsafe or in disrepair. This money will be allocated on a firstcome, first-served basis until the money runs out.

In Summary:
> The City will pay for concrete, sand and rebar to replace/repair a sidewalk $48^{\prime \prime}$ wide, $4^{\prime \prime}$ thick.
> The homeowner is responsible for all the costs, including but not limited to:

- Removal of existing sidewalk (City will provide dump site)
- Labor for setting forms, placing and finishing the concrete, removing forms and backing filling to the new sidewalk
- Concrete for sidewalks across driveways MUST be 6 inches deep with the City paying for four inches and the property owner paying for two inches.
> The property owner must:
- Fill out a Sidewalk Improvement Application
- Contact DIG-SAFE
- Receive approval by City on pre-concrete inspection
> If the property is a corner lot, the City crew will replace the curb with an ADA ramp, with the City supplying labor and materials for the ramp only. This work MUST be coordinated with City Personnel.
> The City will participate in driveways only to the extent to allow for a smooth transition from the new public sidewalk to private driveways. The extent of the City's participation is at the sole discretion of the City.

Minimum Sidewalk Width: 48"
Joint Space: 36" Minimum
Rebar Minimum: 3/8"
Concrete Depth: Minimum 4"
